"Samaritan's Feet is dedicated to taking a message of hope to hurting people. The 5K Life Walk is just one more way that we demonstrate the love of God by touching people's hearts while meeting their physical needs," he said "Our vision extends to hosting other Life Walks and races in major cities across the country. We intend to continue to create awareness of the need to equip impoverished children with shoes in Africa, Asia, South America, Eastern Europe, The United States and other parts of the world."

Ohonme says the unique aspect of the ministry is the ease for families to get involved.

"We actually just awarded our Samaritan's Service Achievement Award to Melissa Brashear, an 11-year-old fifth-grader from Cox Elementary in Concord," he said. "She came to one of our concerts at Concord Mills last January in partnership with New Life 91.9 and she took it upon herself to kick-off a shoe drive. She raised more than 65 brand new pairs of shoes with \$65 as a way to touch children in Africa. She got shoes as far as Chicago, Maryland, New York. She got all her family members involved. That's what it means to be a Samaritan. To love someone you may never met or touch, but with the gift of a shoe, you get the chance to touch their heart with the message of Christ. 
