

"Eye health is very important," Richardson. "People who may not have full health care don't see eye health as primary health care. There's no pain attached to glaucoma. The only evidence will show up when afflicted. One of the signs you can't see out

of your peripheral vision. You're left with tunnel vision and eventually you will turn blind"




