Pool of able rural pastors dropping

LOUISVILLE, Ky. - Small rural Protestant churches are finding it increasingly dif-ficult to fill full-time pastor jobs, as the ranks of qualified pastors shrink.

The new challenge for these churches is that those called to be pastors are unwilling or unable to live on the smaller salaries paid by out-of-theway churches.

"If we could distribute our clergy, we'd have enough," said Bishop James Stuck, the leader of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Religion documentary

America. Stuck is struggling to fill 12 vacancies in small churches in Indiana and Kentucky with about four available ministers.

"But distribution is a prob-lem because of where folks need to locate," Stuck said.

Protestant church officials cite many factors for why people choose not to go into ministry, including more interest in high-paying professions; the cost of attending seminary; a failure by churches to recruit; and a growing secular mindset in society

In the Presbyterian Church

(USA), which is based in Louisville, one in three churches is without a permanent pastor and are forced to rely on substitutes or lay leaders.

In at least two other denominations – the Evan-gelical Lutheran Church in America and the Reformed Church in America - one in five congregations lacks a permanent pastor, The Courier-Journal reported in Sunday's editions.
