bility of the federal, state and county government to help people in need.

Currently, it Federal, state county gov-

ernment bear most of the expense for assistance programs such as Medicaid, Work First, and food stamps. Mecklenburg is expected to spend \$56.6 mil-

lion for fiscal year 2005-2006. But, the federal government will be spending a lot more. During fiscal year 2004-2005, only 10 percent of total fiduciary funds to the county Department of Social came Mecklenburg taxpayers, 25 percent is supplied by the state, 64.5 percent by the federal government, and 0.5 percent from other sources.

Margaret Simms PhD, vice president of governance and economic analysis at the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies, nation's largest black think tank, says federal involvement is needed.

"If the private sector takes the lead or faith based institutions, then government should find a way to provide incentives because society as a whole would benefit," she

Representatives from nonprofit organizations like the Urban League of Central Carolinas say federal assistance is a necessity, especially after the 9/11 attacks left America in a recession in 2001. "This is no time for the government's programs to be entrenched. We all have a stake in making sure people have opportunities for upward mobility, Madine Fails, the Urban League's president and CEO

have nots in breaking the cycle of pover-ty. It should be top priority in list of to-do's,' Sheila Funderburke, Urban League's vice

president of workforce development

Zeigler argues that the government's welfare system creates a cycle of poverty. "When civil society is providing assistance, it's short term tailored assistance until people get back on their feet and into the job market," she said, adding that people feel more accountability to community organi-

"With the government people begin to feel entitled, some people also don't feel bad milking the system because it's a faceless entity and they don't see it as this is their neighbor or their community," she said. "When you provide the option of long-term assistance, then you've created a problem because you might have someone who will choose that option and you create dependency, not only for them but for their families. You begin to see people who are trapped in a cycle of dependency because the assistance


"There were fights about it and when it passed, it decreased benefits for low income people and increased responsibility for women who had to decide if they're receiving TANF benefits," said Marcia Shobe PhD, professor for the department of social work at UNC Charlotte. set five-year time limits for welfare in a lifetime, so if you hit that clock, you would never get public assistance again.

A Children's Defense Fund report says that change produced devastating consequences for women and children. "The number of jobless women with children not receiving welfare rose by 188,000 in one year, leaving a record three quarters of all single mothers without public assistance and causing a sudden surge in extreme child poverty," the report states.

Today, the politics remain divided, but what remains clear is in the war on poverty women and children are the main victims and every taxpayer is paying the price. The bottom line, as Republican Mecklenburg commissioner Bill James said:

"Poverty is a societal problem, so we all have to share the pain."


