more than qualified for the position of Chief Justice.

We are pleased that most of the questions we submitted were asked by various members of the Senate Judiciary Committee. However, we were very disappointed that Judge Roberts' chose to avoid responding to the questions concerning civil rights. Instead of explaining his views on civil rights or indicating any changes, Judge Roberts chose to avoid answering these questions. His evasive responses mainly focused on his youth as a


claim to have been only a staff lawyer, when in fact throughout his service, Judge Roberts often advised recommended presidents Ronald Reagan and George H.W. Bush on administration policy and strategic approaches to civil rights matters, not legal issues or language. His responses only heightened our concerns.

"Judge Roberts' dexterous display of restraint was applauded by many, who were left appreciating his overall posture and presentation," Berryhill said. "His per-

formance demonstrates why President Bush nominated him, and why his immediate confirmation is warranted.

Until Roberts is confirmed which President Bush wants by Oct. 3 when the Supreme Court convenes — the CBC will hold out for his
