says she has things in common with white home schooling parents, including being born-again Christians, but there's still a need to associate with other African-American families and to make sure their children can get to know other black children

"The image they see so much of the time is not a positive image of black Americans, and being a minority in a minority where they do not see many people who look like them-there's just a need to connect," she

To help guide African-American families, Joyce Burges and her husband, Eric, started the National Black Home Educators Resource Association in 2000. She said many families were dissatisfied with their public schools, but were unaware that home schooling was

legal. The Baton Rouge-area resident says she and other black home schoolers have been likened to Revolutionary traitor Benedict Arnold by people who think they've turned their backs on the long struggle to gain equal access to public education. But, she when schools aren't



children should come first.

You do what you have to do that your children get an excellent education," she said. "Don't leave it up to the system.'
