Sometimes when history repeats itself it's not such a bad thing

Ford Motor Company sold a Zephyr way back in the late '70s, maybe early '80s. It was an ugly, awful thing, prone to breakdowns and devoid of any cool points.

Not so for the new Lincoln Zephyr. It's stylish inside and out. It's part of a set of triplets which also include the Ford Fusion and the Mercury Milan. All are based on a modified Mazda 6 chassis. It differs because of the classic Lincoln waterfall grill more stylish rear end and abundance of standard equipment.

The shape is nearly the same as the Fusion. The grill gives the car a more upscale appearance. The classy taillight treatment is also a plus.

The interior is done right There is real wood, or what I think is real wood everywhere. The blond color was perfect for the sand interior. The same for the nickel-look controls. The leather is soft and chrome accents abound. The dash is certainly modern and stylish.

The Zephyr uses the same 3.0-liter DOHC V6 used in the Milan and Fusion. It makes 221 horsepower and 205 pounds-feet of torque. Coupled to a six-speed transmission, the combination is a formidable pair. Acceleration is more brisk than expected. This is no speed demon, but you can weave in and out of traffic stylishly and easily.

The four-wheel indepen dent suspension absorbs bumps graciously and has a modicum of handling prowess. You can get aggressive and not get embarrassed

so long as you don't push the car real hard. The clientele for this automobile will appreciate the firm but comfortable ride more than any handling attributes.

The Zephyr is packed with gaggles of stuff. Ten-way adjustable passenger and driver seats, dual zone electronic climate leather seats, traction assist, speed sensitive wipers, rear window defroster, cruise control, side curtain airbags, ABS, keyless remote, message center, heated power mirrors and heated front seats are standard. Extras include a navigation system, HID headlamps and cooled front seats.

At \$33,145, the Zephyr isn't cheap, but it's also a nicely finished sedan that doesn't feel cheap. There are bigger and less expensive sedans in this class, but they will not have the Zephyr's pinache


