Activists arrested at Virginia college

LYNCHBURG. Va. -More LYNCHEURG, Va. – More than 20 gay rights activists were arrested on trespassing charges Priday as they tried to step onto the campus of Liberty University, the school founded by the Rev. Jerry Fal-well. la foun-ell

well. Many of the activists were part of Soulforce, a group on its first stop of a nationwide "Equality Ride" tour to pro-mote gay rights at the nation's conservative Christ-ian universities and military academies. demies

academies. Invoking the memory of the civil rights movement, Soul-force member Jacob Reitan said: "We want to come to the school today to say, 'learn from history." from histor

"We have a right to be here, because this school teaches that being gay is being sick and sinful," said Reitan, co-director of Equality Ride. "We have a right to question and to show how we are children of God." Reitan and other Soulforce members said they did not intend to be arrested at the campus, but just hoped to talk to Liberty students. Some 60 people, including 55 members of the Equality Ride bus tour, gathered for the late morning rally on a sidewalk outside the school's main entrance. A music group played guitars and sang 1960s peace songs. Several Liberty students played guitars and sang 1960s peace songs. Several Liberty students spoke to the Soulforce mem-
