The foundational reason God should be praised is that He is great. "Greatness" is one of very difficult to define pre-cisely. It refers to something of size and magnitude. A great person is someone of importance As the Creator and Sustainer of the universe and the Lord of all, God is, of course, great beyond measure and most worthy of our sionally or merely on the Sabath, David plans to promote Him day by day. Sometimes we fool ourselves into thinking that we will do great things for God "someday" That usually is neither necessary nor valuable. Daily consistency in small things will win out in the long run. Daily prayer is a start. Following that, we may make it our goal to speak to one person today about Jesus Christ. This could be very low key-perhaps a comment like, "I am grateful to God for my family." Such conversation starters may not seem like much, but God can use them to do great things. Do not let another day go by without publicly praising and blessing the name of God. When David said he would praise God "for ever and ever," he was emphasizing that God's greatness will last forever. His reign is eternal. There also may be a hint here of a confidence in life beyond the grave for God's people. At the very least David was declaring that as long as he was able, he would sing God's praises.
