Noble Son of Former Student Establishes Fund in Memory of Mother

The Chowan spirit of 1848 still lives. The following letter has just been received by Miss Eunice McDowell:

"I am sending you in this letter my check for \$1000.00 made payable to you for the benefit of Chowan College in memory of my mother. I feel that you will most likely get all that is needed to rehabilitate your library and if that is true, I would like to see this thousand dollars put in trust for the benefit of the library fund and the income from it to be used from time to time as required to help buy new books that are needed. However, this is only a suggestion to you. If you have some better plan, it will be entirely satisfactory to me.

Mr. Sheppard is a son of Elizabeth Neal, a member of the graduating class of 1856, and one of the original eleven students who matriculated at the opening of the institution October 11, 1848. He is president of the firm of Sheppard and Myers, makers of the famous Hanover Shoe, Hanover, Pa.
