

# Chowan Meets Conway All-Stars Today

The Chowan Braves' baseball team will meet the Conway All-Stars on the Chowan College diamond this afternoon at 2:30 p.m. This will be the first baseball game at Chowan College. The outcome of this game is unpredictable just as the first games in the other sports have been in which Chowan has participated this year. The Chowan boys have become familiar with their teammates in the classroom during this year, but to function as a well-organized baseball team will have to come from experience of working together just as in football and basketball. The boys have never played together and they are from all parts of Eastern North Carolina and Southeastern Virginia.

Coach Melvin Layton has drilled a squad of twenty boys for the past two weeks when the weather was suitable. The team is taking shape and will be full swing this afternoon to meet their opponent. Although the starting lineup has not been named, the uniforms have been issued to the prospective squad from which the team will be picked.

The team is well-dressed and well equipped and raring to go. The uniforms are grayish-blue with blue hats and socks.

The Chowan students and faculty are hoping that outsiders will become interested in their new baseball team. Bleachers have been set up and parking area has been provided for spectator's automobiles.

The schedule for this season is not complete, but there are several games scheduled with junior colleges and high school.

The boys who have earned their letters in participation of sports this year have recently organized the Chowan College Monogram Club, with Coach Melvin Layton as faculty member in charge. The official badge of the club will be a gold "C" key.

The constitution has been presented to President Bunn and has received his official o.k.

The club was organized by the athletes "to foster and maintain among the members a spirit of fraternalism, a spirit of mutual and moral support to instill a love for, and loyalty of, good feeling and fellowship throughout the campus."

Membership to the club is obtained by any varsity letterman approved by the athletic committee of the college, who has participated in one or more seasons in either football, basketball, baseball, track, tennis, or golf. Exception to this rule must be made by a three-fourths vote of the quorum present at the time when the case is presented. There will be three admission periods for membership per school year. These will be in December, March and May.

Eligible candidates for membership in the club will be issued bids at the admission periods. The honorary members of the club will be coaches of teams, the president and dean, and others by a three-fourths vote of the quorum present.

Regular meetings are to be held every Thursday night at 7 o'clock in the club room. It has not yet been decided where the club room will be.

Elections for next year were held when the club organized. Bobby Dough of Manteo was elected president. Other officers are Curtis Copeland, Suffolk, Va., vice-president; Jimmy Coker, secretary; Fred Parker Murfreesboro, treasurer; and Calvin Basnight, Plymouth, sergeant-at-arms.

The club will endeavor to coordinate the athletic program at Chowan.
