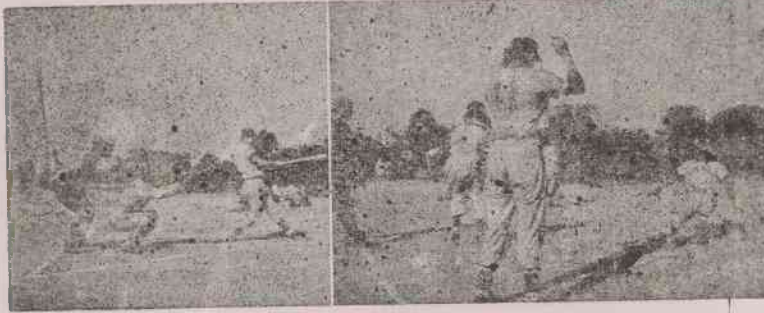

William Stradley kicked 5 extra points. Chowan plays at Mars Hill this week in a Non Conference Game.

Cheer Leaders Are Selected

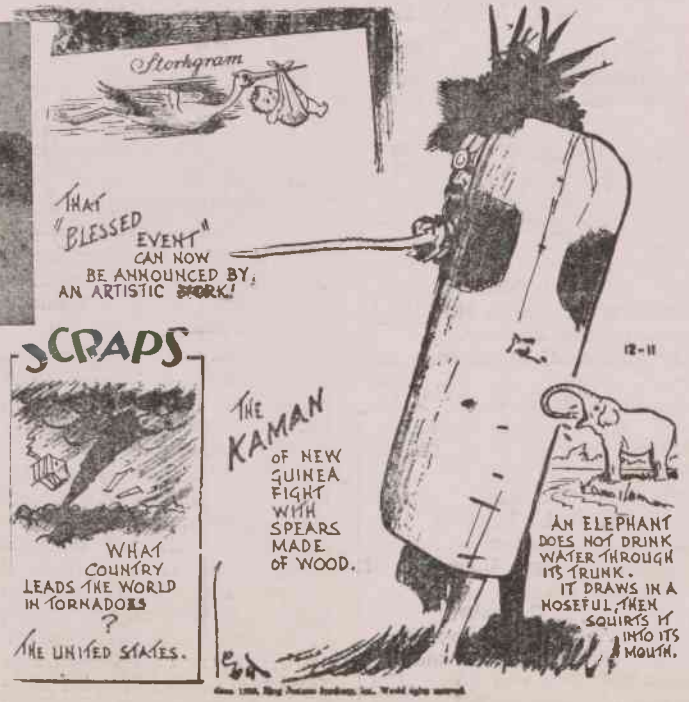
