

Braves Split Two With P.J.C. Losing 78-65, Winning 50-46

The Chowan College Basketball Braves lost a hard fought contest to the Scotties of Presbyterian Junior College Friday night January 9, in the college gym, 78-65, but came back in a Saturday night encounter to dump the same foe by a 50-46 count.

P.J.C. jumped into an early lead Friday night and led until early in the second half when the Braves tied it at 40-all. Chowan went ahead 42-41 after P.J.C.'s free throw had broken the deadlock.

The score was tied again at 49 apiece. After that P.J.C. moved into the lead to stay and pulled way out in front in the last two minutes when the Braves fouled repeatedly in a futile effort to gain possession of the ball.

Captain Bob Jesson paced the Presbyterian attack with 25 points and veteran Forward Eldon Petrea followed close behind with 20.

"Rod" Page, diminutive letterman guard, led the Braves with 18 points, and his running mate in the backcourt, Garland Caudle, pushed in 12 points.

Saturday night, January 10, the Braves were a different ball team and they were in control throughout the game, although the score was close all the way.

P.J.C.'s big guns Jesson and Petrea, who got 45 points between them the night before, were held to 10 each in Saturday's clash. Guard Jackie Hussey was the Presbyterian leader with 12 points.

Co-captain Norman Phillips whipped the cords for 16 points to set the pace for the Braves.

He was followed by rookie guard Garland Caudle with 13.

The Men's Judiciary Counsel continue to handle many discipline problems among the boys.

The Counsel was started during the 1957-1958 term and has been working for good behavior habits and cooperation among all new students.

It is a part of the Student Government and works along the same line as the Woman's Judiciary which has been in effect for a number of years.

This year, under the direction of Dean of Men, Jerry Hawkins, and Assistant Dean, Jim Masters, the boys have proven capable of handling all affairs given them.

They have established a demerit system in which an offender is issued demerits according to the seriousness of the offense. After a student has been issued three demerits, the Counsel must take some disciplinary action. If the student should receive five demerits he is immediately put on probation or disciplinary restriction. If any student should receive nine demerits he would be subject to expulsion if approved by the Student Affairs Committee, made up of faculty members.

The Counsel has the power to suggest any punishment it finds justifiable to the Student Affairs

Committee where a student breaks college rules.
