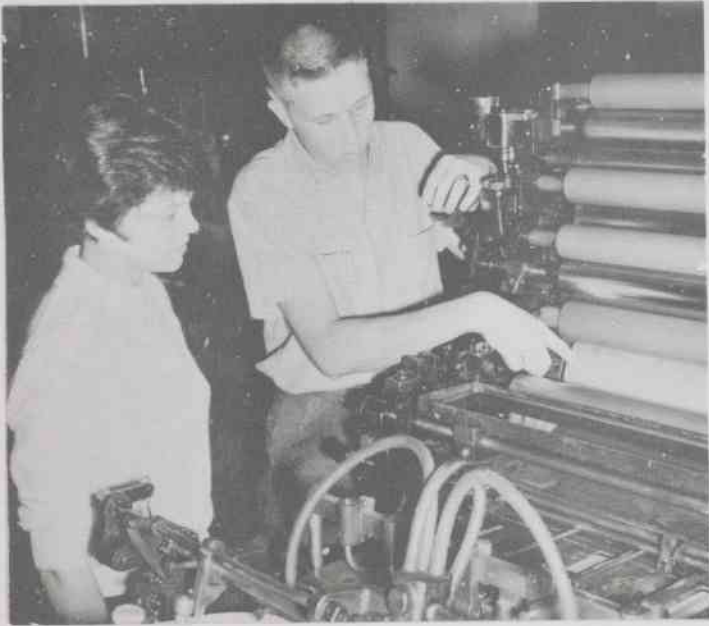


Two Outstanding Publications

The two major publications at Chowan are The Chowanian, monthly newspaper, and the Chowanoka, the college annual. Both of these have student staffs with faculty advisors.

The Chowanian is completely produced in the plant of the School of Graphic Arts. This includes design, layout, composition, photography laboratory and photolithography printing.

The Chowanoka's pictures, with the exception of the individual photographs, are also processed in the printing department, as is the design, layout and printing. The covers are manufactured and embossed by the Kingsport Press, Kingsport, Tenn.

Thomas, Norfolk, Va., and William Patterson Scotland Neck, staff photographers; David Bedsole, Fayetteville, circulation manager; Doris Edwards, Spring Hope, Keith Abbott, Rocky Mount; Charles Herring, Wilson; Bill Welch, Tyner; are the reporters.

Faculty advisors are John McSweeney, Dr. William C. Young, and William B. Sowell.

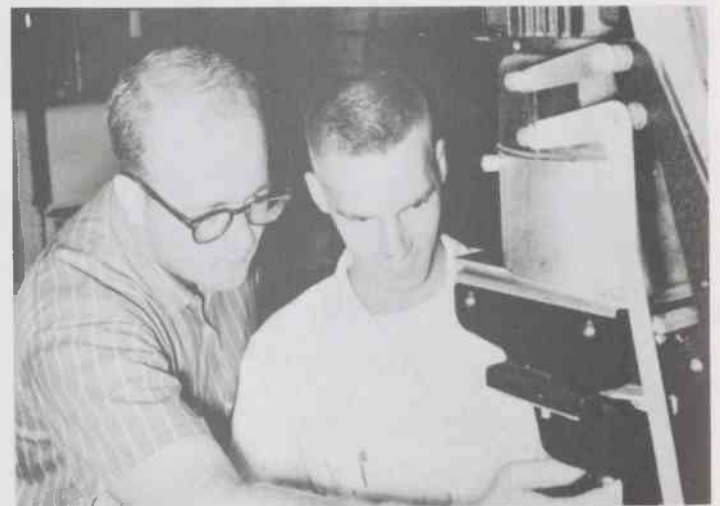
