GREENVILLE-Halfback Tom Grayson helped himself to 15 points as Chowan's "Big Blue" took East Carolina's Frosh team 27-20.

Chowan found that it could move the pigskin on most occasions from the start. The Braves left the Baby Bucs from East Carolina simply puzzled. The Baby Bucs found the going rough as Chowan's mighty defense held them down to 71 yards on the ground.

Grayson, a 5-8, 170 lb. sophomore from Lexington, scored first for Chowan. He also put the first talley up for the game. He gathered in a pass from quarterback Clarence Murphy on the four yard line and took four giant steps to make it 6-0,

With his usual stride he added the point after TD to give the Braves a 7-0 lead with just a minute and 43 seconds left to play in the first quarter.

Moments later the Baby Bucs were forced to punt and Cary Slade charged through to block. With the speed of a bullet Slade had blocked the punt and the were touchdown bound again.
