### Almost Perfect Scores

In gaining this achievement, it was given almost perfect scores on ratings in all areas, including photography, design, lay-out, make-up and news content. Earlier, "The Chowanian" received an honor award from the Baptist Public Relations Association and was the only collegiate newspaper in North Carolina so honored. Chowan College is the only junior college in the United States which publishes not only a monthly news-magazine, "The Chowanian," but also a daily newspaper, "The Daily Chowanian."
