According to Jaycee Publicity Chairman Don Daniels, she was coming back to college after a weekend at home and was forced off the road into a ditch by another car. She was not hospitalized but spent some time in the hospital emergency room having slivers of glass removed from her face.

Miss Smith will receive a \$200 savings bond from pageant sponsors, merchandise from the Ahoskie Department Store, luggage from Belk-Tyler in Ahoskie and Murfreesboro, sports outfit from Johnna's in Ahoskie engraved trophy from the Jaycees and an all-expense paid trip to the state pageant in Charlotte.
