Tyler is a setter and co-captain for the Lady Braves. She was named All Conference and to the Southeastern 4A All District Team as a member of the Hoke County High School squad in 1978.

Bacote, a hitter, captained the Harding High School team in 1978 when she was named All Conference. She was Harding's Most Improved

Player in 1977 and Most Valuable Player in 1978. Harding placed second in the state last year.
