
Nine New Members Join Board of Trustees

Randy V. Britton. . . Ahoskie


Randy V. Britton is an alumnus of Chowan College and also attended Campbell College. He is vice president and general manager of Carolina Aluminum Co. in Winton.


A Menola native, he lives in Ahoskie with
