Convention V-P delivers address

Mrs. A. Harrison Gregory, first vice president of the Southern Baptist Convention, was the featured speaker for the annual Founders' Day Convocation on Monday, October 12. The program was held in the Jesse Helms Physical Education Center.

Mrs. Gregory's topic for the meeting of students, faculty, staff, and guests, was "Maintaining a 'School of High Order'."

Elected in June, 1981, to her current position, Mrs. Gregory is the first woman in the convention's 136-year history to serve as first vice president. She is only the third woman ever elected to any convention office.

Prior to the June session of the convention, she served for six consecutive years as president of the Woman's Missionary Union, auxiliary to the Southern Baptist Convention.

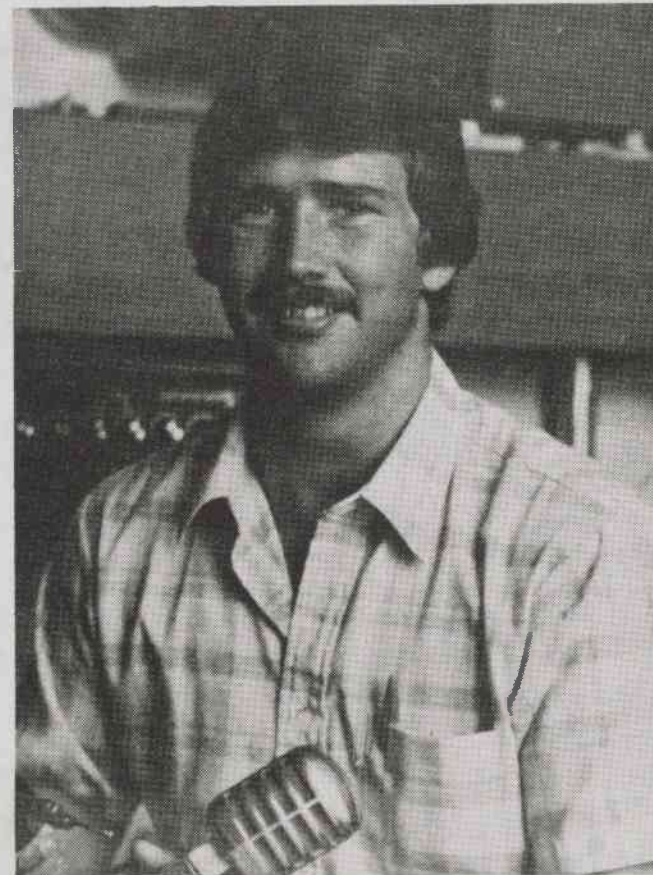
SCHOLARSHARE
