Lady Braves take third in regionals



In the first round, Chowan defeated North Greenville by scores of 9-15, 15-12, and 15-3, and was led by hitters Vanessa Martinez and Rachael Rhodes.

In the second round, the Lady Braves were knocked off by Anderson in three games. Taking three of four matches from Chowan this season, the Lady Trojans' depth was the deciding edge against Coach Janet Collins' scrappy eight.

In the consolation finals, Chowan faced Spartanburg Methodist, who defeated the Lady Braves to capture second place honors in the tournament.
