NEW SCHOOL LEGISLATION

Special Session of Legislature Made New Provisions of Bene

Reviewing the work of the re cent special session of the North Carolina Legislature with particular reference to school regislation State Superintendent of schools C E. Brooks says:

"The salary sehedule adopted by the teachers at the Greensboro conference, providing for an increase in salaries based on efficiency and continued service in the same school was provided when the State tax of 13 cents was authorized by the finance committee. There was absolutely no opposition to it. More over, the counties and the capital tax districts were given sufficient latitude, either throngh a tax levy or through power to borrow money to meet the schedule. Therefore, the school term in every district for 1920-21 may be maintained for the same length it was maintained in 1919-20
