

ELLENSON McDUGALD GOES TO NATIONAL CLUB CAMP

As Guest of The Atlantic Coast Line Railway—Other 4-H National Club Members From North Carolina Will Also Attend as Guests of This Railroad—Object of the Camps to Give Rural Youth an Opportunity to Become Better Acquainted With the United States Department of Agriculture.

State club leaders have selected Mary Emma Powell, Turkey, Sampson county; Ellenson McDougald, Jonesboro, Lee county, North Carolina; Julia May Arnette, Lake View, Dillon county, South Carolina; John Duncan, Jessup, Wayne county, Dorris Dozier, Valdosta, Lowndes county, Georgia; Hugh Dukes, Lake Butler, Union county, and Guida Yates, Orlando, Orange county, Florida, as winners of trips offered by Atlantic Coast Line to the 4-H National Club Camp, Washington, D. C., June 18th to 24th.

These fortunate youths will be guests of the Atlantic Coast Line en route to and from Washington and while in the National Capitol during the camp period.

For the past three years the Coast Line railroad has offered to pay the expenses of one outstanding boy and one outstanding girl from each of the States served. This offer is limited to club members residing in counties directly served by the company. Last year Helen Drinker, Richmond county, Coast Line girl, won the highest camp honor. Mrs. Hoover presented her with the Secretary of Agriculture trophy, a large loving cup. This year the Coast Line is unfortunate in not having a boy or girl from Virginia, but this State will be ably represented.

In addition to Mary Emma Powell and Ellenson McDougald, North Carolina will be represented at the camp by Lena Early, Statesville, Irrell county, and Pauline Moore, Conover, Catawba county. South Carolina will be represented by Hattie Monts, of Richland county, Percy Anderson, of Florence county, and Harper Welborn, of Anderson county, in addition to Miss Arnette, the Coast Line girl. Delegates from at least 42 States have been selected to attend the national camp. Each state and the territory of Hawaii may select four delegates to attend the camp, two boys and two girls, who have made outstanding achievements in agriculture or home economics.

The purpose of this camp is to give these representative rural youths an opportunity to become better acquainted with the work and facilities of the United States Department of Agriculture, to study their government in first hand, and to meet with club leaders and fellow clubmembers from other states.

After the trucks have been loaded they are kept moving day and night till they reach the markets. It is claimed dewberries and peaches hauled by truck reach the market in better shape than when carried by rail. They are not kept in artificial temperature and are in the natural state when they reach the market. The dewberry crop is about over, but soon the peach and watermelon crops will begin to move in a big way.
