A COTTON-PICKING ACT.

The Southern planter has often longed for something to take the place of the colored brother in the cotton field. To harvest the fleecy staple something like 5,000,000 of the black folk are needed. Along has come a man who has been thinking of picking cotton by machinery, and at last an automobile for the cotton fields has come into use.

It seems strange that no one has ever thought that the contents of the cotton boll could be pulled out by mechanical fingers, instead of human fingers. That is what the picker does. Instead of two arms, however, it has no less than eight, and a 10-year-old darky can be trained in an hour to guide two of these arms at such a rate that a machine which traveled over a cotton field in Alabama picked and bagged six bales of the staple, weighing 500 pounds each, in a day of ten hours.
