Washington, N. C., Oct. 18.—The money for the head road, how ever, will be paid to all those who have been in the road, when there is \$100,000 in money to be spent. It is a great deal better to get a good man \$10,000 and get a full \$100,000 worth of good roads than it is to get an incompetent man \$2,000 and get only \$7,000 of poor road work.

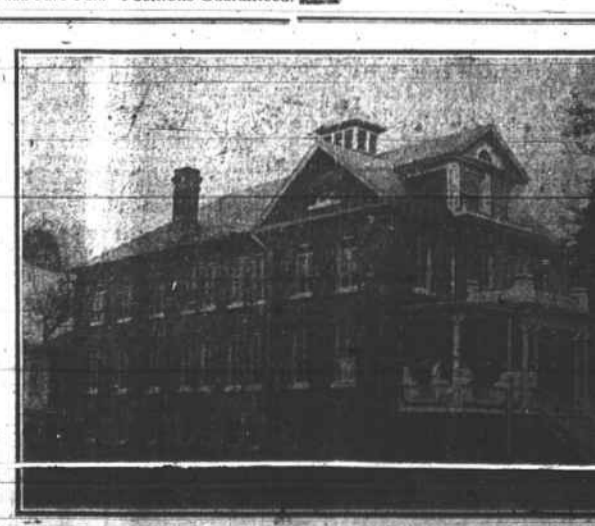
