M. Ds. Denounce Whiskey Law

Greensboro, N. C., Oct. 28.—At a special meeting of the Guilford County Medical Society held here this afternoon for the purpose of taking some official action in regard to the recent prosecutions of members of the society for alleged violation of the prohibition laws of North Carolina in prescribing whiskey to patients, strong resolutions condemning the action of the city authorities for the method used in securing evidence against physicians, together with a resolution forbidding any druggist from exhibiting prescriptions to the chief of police or any officer unless he has the written consent of either physician or patient, were adopted by a vote of 24 to 6.

The meeting, which was held behind closed doors, is said to have been replete with sensations and condemning charges against the city officials who conducted the recent prosecutions. Members indignant.

It was stated after the meeting by members of the society that practically every one present denounced the law which made it possible for a police officer to say whether a man needed whisky or not. The society pledged its united efforts toward discontinuing such a perversion of justice in the name of law, and toward repelling the assault upon the efficiency of the medical profession in its integrity, involved in such a procedure and the recent prosecutions and to this end the resolution forbidding any druggists from exhibiting a prescription written by a member of the society to any officer or his inspection.

The society reaffirmed the State resolution of the State Medical Society and pledged its hearty support to the resolutions adopted in 1908 in which the State society passed a resolution declaring that it would revoke the license of any physician who may be proven guilty of abusing the privilege accorded them by the Legislature of 1905 in prescribing intoxicants.
