SOUTHERN PROGRESS. What the South has in material resources in comparison with the resources of this country and of others, what it has accomplished in material development as compared with the progress of the United States, condensed but comprehensively presented, will be found in the "Annual Blue Book of Southern Progress for 1909," just issued by the Manufacturers' Round, more thorough and complete than any publication ever issued.

REPORT ALL ACCIDENTS. Washington, Dec. 17.—The bill requiring common carriers engaged in interstate and foreign commerce to make full reports of all accidents to the Interstate Commerce Commission and authorizing the commission to investigate such accidents passed the House today.

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MUCH OR LITTLE.

Taking the position of both Democrats and Republicans, the ratio is six to one in favor of local option, while among Democrats the ratio is five to one.
