TWO-YEAR-OLD GIRL DROWNED IN WASHTUB. Mother Absent From Room for a Few Minutes and She Fell In.

Pocahontas, Va., July.—While its mother, Mrs. J. H. Meadows, was absent from the room for three minutes, the little two-year-old girl fell into a wash tub about half filled with water, and when the mother returned she found the little lifeless body submerged and dead from drowning.

A physician was hastily summoned but it was useless. Mrs. Meadows had been washing, and called from the room, she took the clothes from the tub, which sat on a chair by the table. The child was playing about the room, and with no thought of danger, it was left behind. The only feasible way for the little tot to have fallen in was to have climbed on to the table to splash the water.
