From Lincoln, Neb., comes a story that should inspire many a man and woman who have compromised with their ideals or given them up as unattainable.

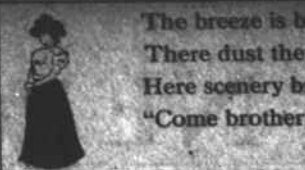
