W. T. Freeman and Others vs. Willis Robertson and Others.  
To all land owners and other persons interested in the Pungo River Drainage District:  
Take notice that the total cost of the proposed improvement in this district exceeds an average of 25 cents per acre on all lands in the district.

Further take notice that the said district through its commissioners proposes to issue bonds for the payment of the total cost of the improvement; that the amount of bond to be issued is \$52,500.00; that the rate of interest they are to bear is 6 per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually. That the said bonds are to be made payable in ten (10) equal annual installments. The first of said installments will be due and payable three years after date of issue, and one installment for each succeeding year for nine additional years.

Further take notice that any land owner in the district not wanting to pay interest on the bonds may within fifteen (15) days after the publication of this notice (which is to be published within three weeks from this date) pay to the County Treasurer of Washington County the full amount for which his land is liable, to be ascertained from the classification sheet and the certificate of the Board showing the total cost of the improvement (which classification sheet and certificate are now on file in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Washington County at Plymouth, N. C.), and have his lands released from liability to be assessed for the said improvement; but such land shall continue liable for any future assessment for maintenance or for any increase of assessment authorized by law.
