## WOMAN PARTY WORKING HARD TO BEAT WILSON

Washington, Sept. 18.—As the campaign of the Woman party, whose single plank is national enfranchisement of women, progresses in the twelve Western equal suffrage States, the prospects of victory become brighter and brighter, according to reports reaching here from the organizers and other workers of the party.

Among the evidences of the growing strength of the Woman party movement are reports of enthusiastic meetings everywhere. Hundreds of Western voting women are being converted daily to the belief that it would be contrary to their own best interests, as well as those of the women in the East, to return the national Democratic party to power after its stubborn refusal to do anything for federal woman suffrage. Other reports show that the Democrats themselves, thoroughly aroused over the prospect of losing so many women's votes, are making strenuous efforts to counteract it as much as possible by back-fire methods; in this, however, the reports show that they are not succeeding very well.

Chicago, Sept. 18.—New styles in milady's corsets, gowns and dresses were on exhibition here today at the annual autumn convention of the Fashion Art League of America.

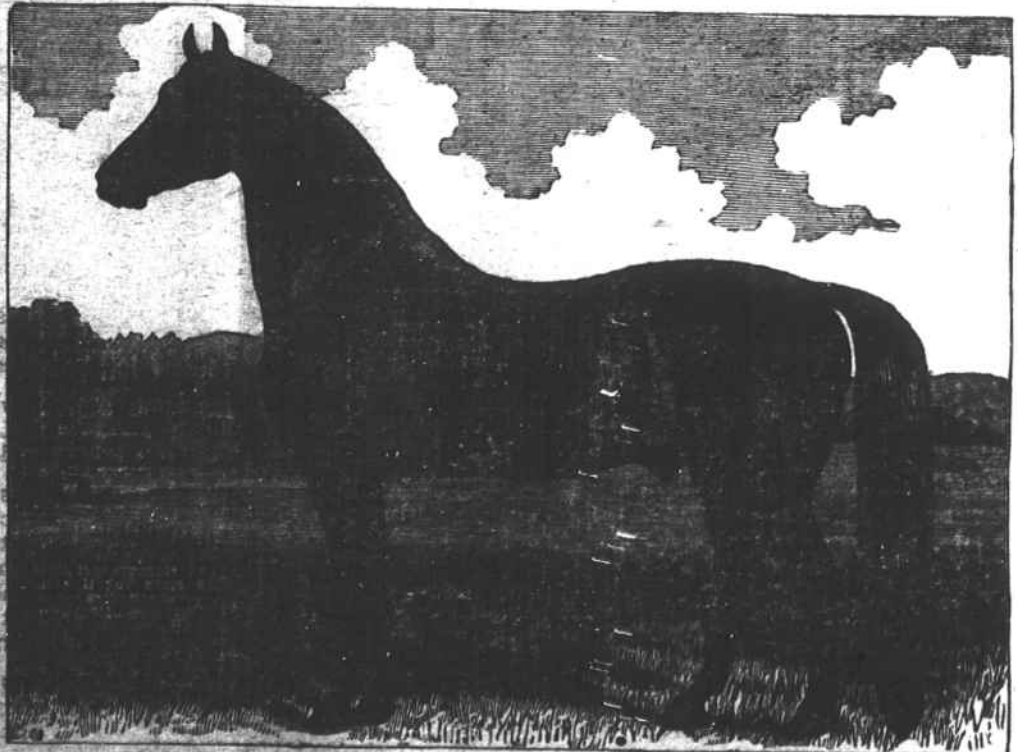
