AMERICA PUT IN FIRST RANK BY THE WAR

Paris, Sept. 20.—Max Hoeschler, in an article in the Paris Temps yesterday, contrasts America's financial position now in respect to foreign countries with what it was before the war. The article says:

"Then the United States was sending to Europe from \$200,000,000 to \$300,000,000 in interest on its borrowings, \$150,000,000 to \$200,000,000 spent by tourists, \$100,000,000 to \$150,000,000 to expatriates and \$20,000,000 to \$40,000,000 on ocean freights."

"Since the war the United States has imported \$750,000,000 in gold, and has paid back a considerable amount of its previous borrowings, increased its foreign trade by \$2,250,000,000 yearly and loaned to foreign countries \$1,470,000,000, so that the dollar now has replaced to a considerable extent the old sovereignty of the English pound abroad."
