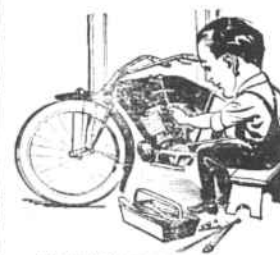
**E. L. STEWART GETS GREAT RECEPTION FROM THE PEOPLE OF TOWN OF EDWARD**
