Misses Helen Turner and Annis Lay Winstead were Shallotte visitors Thursday evening.

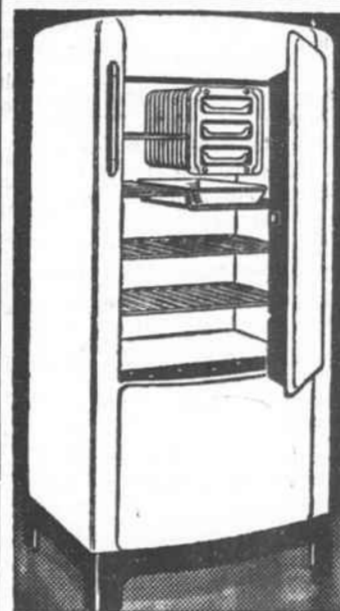
