Social Security Question Box

be made on Form SS-5. This can be got at any post office or at your nearest Social Security Board office. Keep your account card but give your number to your employer. He will need the number to make required reports to the Treasury Department, which is charged with collecting the taxes levied under the Social Security Act. Do not lose your card. Memorize your number and you will not need to carry your card with you.

Question No. 4. I run a saw mill and employ two men. I understand the Social Security Act applied only to those who had eight or more employees.

Answer No. 4. You are an employer covered by the Act and you should have an employer's identification number—Application Form SS-4—and you should see that each of your employees has a Social Security Account Number (Application Form SS-5). Under Title VII of the Act, you are required to deduct one per cent of the wages paid each employer, to the Collector of Internal Revenue each month. The Treasury has prepared a special monthly tax return, Form SS-1, which should be used. Get this form from your Collector of Internal Revenue. If you will call at the Social Security Board office at 116 S. Salisbury Street in Raleigh, we will help you with your problems connected with the law.

Commenting on the fact that Brunswick county is now being overrun by land speculators and buyers representing two different pulp mill companies, Postmaster L. T. Yaskell, of Southport, a former chairman of the board of county commissioners said:
"The money that Brunswick county has been putting out for forest fire protection during the past several years was a hundred fold the best investment ever made. The benefits were felt long ago and they are getting bigger and bigger."
"And these benefits are general. All sections of the county are reaping a profit. With about 80 per cent of the land area of Brunswick timber land, growing wood of one sort or another, the benefits could not well be confined to any small locality or section. Land owners all over this county are now getting a good price for lands that were formerly worthless, or they are holding off for the still better price that the future will bring."
"The county has been credited by state officials as having one of the very best forest fire preventing systems in the state. It has been working smoothly and efficiently. A few years ago a drive around the county revealed little but burned and blackened trees and stumps. To drive around now over this same area makes one realize how lucky Brunswick was in deciding to stop the destruction of timber and the continued impoverishing of the whole county."
