The boat moves alongside the girl, now supported by the jacket, and a brawny guardsman reaches over and yanks her into the boat, she is stretched across a seat and the water forced out of her lungs. The final shows the Coast Guard moving away and laughing about it, after returning the young lady to the boat from which she fell.
