(Continued From Page One) with Pinch Gut creek to the Green swamp, thence South East to Old-Georgetown road including Jewell McKeithan farm, thence the Galloway road to highway No. 17, thence Bolivia-Midway road by Rube Lewis' filling station, to and with CCC road to highway No. 303 and with highway to the beginning.

Bolivia Community: Beginning at Rices Creek and running with the Winnabow - Funston - Oaks-Plantation road to the point where this road crosses the River road, then a line Westerly crossing highway No. 303 between Mrs. Emma Willett's farm and Southport and following highway No. 303 to first CCC road to right, thence with CCC road to intersection of Bolivia-Midway road, thence to the intersection of highway No. 17 at Bolivia, then with the Galloway road to where it intersects and crossing the Old-Georgetown road to the head of Pinch Gut creek, then with the border of the Green swamp to the head of Bell swamp and with Bell swamp to where it enters Rices creek and with Rices creek to the bridge on the Winnabow-Funston-Oaks Plantation road.

North West Community: North West Community is bounded by the Columbus County line on the North, by the Cape Fear river on the East to the mouth of Hoods creek, thence with the creek to the Green swamp to the Columbus County line the beginning.

Leland Community: Beginning at the mouth of Hoods creek on the Cape Fear river, thence with said creek to the border of the Green swamp, thence back said creek to where it crosses the Johnson road and with the Johnson road to highway No. 17 at Bishop's store and with highway No. 17 to the New Hanover County line and with the county line and Cape Fear river to the beginning at the mouth of Hoods creek.

Town Creek Community: Beginning at New Hanover County line on highway No. 17 West to Bishop's store, thence with the Johnson road to Hoods creek, thence with Hoods creek to the border of the Green swamp, thence with the border of the Green swamp to the head of Bell swamp, thence with Bell swamp to Rices creek, thence with Rices creek to the Funston-Oaks-Plantation road and with said road to Oaks Planation, thence with Cape Fear river to the beginning on highway No. 17 at the New Hanover County line.

Supply Community: Beginning where Bolivia and Antioch Communities join in the edge of the Green Swamp at the head of Pinch Gut Creek, then running with the edge of the Green Swamp to where Supply-Makatoka road crosses Juniper creek, then with the border of Green Swamp to a point West of Brady Longs, thence to his farm and with public road to Highway No. 17 at W. E. Robinson's farm, then with Highway No. 17 to Supply and with Highway No. 130 to Lockwood Folly river, then with Lockwood Folly river to the mouth of Pinch Gut Creek and with Pinch Gut creek to the Green Swamp.

Mt. Pisgah Community: Beginning at Lockwood Folly River at the bridge on Highway No. 130 with said Highway to Highway No. 17 to J. E. Kirby's store, with turn-pike road to Jesse Robinson's store and with public road from Jesse Robinson's store at Lockwood Folly River at W. H. Varnum's store and with Lockwood Folly River to the Beginning at Supply bridge across Lockwood Folly River.

Boon's Neck Community: Beginning on the Lockwood Folly river at Harry Varnum's running the most direct public road to Jesse Robinson's store, then with most direct public road toward Shallotte to where turns going to Tar Landing on the Shallotte River, then with Shallotte river to the Atlantic Ocean, then with the Atlantic Ocean, then with the Atlantic Ocean to Lockwood Folly

inlet and with Lockwood Folly river including Harry Varnum's store to the beginning.

Shallotte Community: Beginning at the bridge across Juniper creek on Makatoka-Supply road running with the border of the Green Swamp to West of Brady Long's farm, then to road and with road to where it intersects Highway No. 17 at W. E. Robinson farm, then with Highway No. 17 to J. E. Kirby's store, then with turn-pike road to where it intersects Shallotte - Holden Beach road at Will Holden's farm; then with Shallotte-Holden Beach road to the Tar Landing road and with the road to Shallotte river, then with Shallotte river to its head, then a straight line crossing the Shallotte-Whiteville Highway at the fire tower, thence a straight line North East to the beginning.

Grissettown Community: Beginning at the bridge crossing Shallotte River on Highway No. 17, thence with Highway to Grissettown, thence with the Main road to the Mill Pond at Caw Caw Swamp and with Caw Caw Swamp to fire tower on Highway No. 130 and with Highway to Highway bridge the beginning.

Gause Landing Community: Beginning at the mouth of Shallotte River, following the river to the Highway No. 17 at Shallotte, then Highway No. 17 to Grissettown, then with Grissettown-Seaside road to the Atlantic Ocean, with the Atlantic Ocean to Shallotte River inlet.

Thomasboro Community: Beginning at Seaside running with the Seaside-Grissettown road to Grissettown, with Highway No. 17 to Thomasboro and with the hard surface road to the South Carolina line by the Atlantic Ocean and with the ocean to Seaside.

Ash Community: Beginning at the mouth of Wet Ash Swamp on Waccamaw River, thence with said swamp to the Little River road, with road to Regan School

site, thence with Ward road to Mill Pond at Longwood, thence with the Project road to Main road to Grissettown.

Freeland to Wade Coleman Community: Beginning thence up Fork road to Juniper Creek bridge on Sup-Alligator swamp, thence to ply-Makatoka road, thence in an intersection of a CCC road Northeast course to Columbus the Hoover Mill site on Brunswick county line, thence with said line road, thence with CCC road to Waccamaw river, thence with intersection of Supply-Makatoka road to the mouth of Ho-ward's Branch, thence up said creek bridge.

Waccamaw Community: Beginning on the Fork road at Little Alligator swamp, thence with said road to the Project road, thence with the Project road to W. V. Simmons' farm, thence with New Home road to Highway No. 130 running with Highway No. 130 to the edge of the Green Swamp near the fire tower, thence with the border of the Green Swamp to the CCC road near the Hoover Mill, thence a west course to Little Alligator swamp where it crosses the Fork road.

Friendship Community: Beginning at Grissettown and following Highway No. 17 to beyond Thomasboro and hard surface road by Hickman's Cross Roads to the South Carolina line, thence with the line to Waccamaw river, thence up river to the mouth of Wet Ash Swamp, thence with Wet Ash Swamp to Little River road, thence with road to Old Regan
