Registrars shall also attend the polling place on May 6th and 13th for the same purpose of registration of electors. Registration books are to be kept open at home on other days or at office during this period to register electors.

**MAY 13th**  
Date of close of the registration books for both the first and second primaries. Registration closes at sunset on this day.

**MAY 16th**  
Last day for statement of expenditures to be filed by candidates and by campaign committees. All candidates for National State and District offices shall file their statement with the Secretary of the State at Raleigh.

**MAY 20th**  
Challenge Day. The registrars shall attend the polling place with the registration books open at 9 o'clock A. M. until 3 P. M. when and where the books shall be open to the public inspection for the purpose of challenges. The registrar shall that day appoint a time and place when he and the judges will hear and decide the challenges.

**MAY 24th**  
Day on which the Chairman of the County Board of Election shall deliver to the registrars the ballots, ballot boxes, booths, and all other election supplies, taking a receipt for same from the registrars.

**MAY 27th**  
Day when primary election is to be held. The polls shall open at six (6:30) P. M. and close at six (6:30) P. M. The Chairman of the County Board of Election, the members of the County Board of Election, or cause to be delivered, to the registrars all absentee ballot envelopes received from voters in their service with the envelopes unbroken. Before leaving the polling place after the votes have been counted the registrars and judges shall prepare duplicates of the returns of the voting at the precinct and one copy shall be mailed that night to the County Chairman of the Board of Election and one copy shall be placed in the hands of the registrar to deliver to the Chairman of the county canvass on the following Tuesday.
