

Agronomist Suggests Plans For Plant Bed Weed Control

here in order to avoid failure from incorrect applications. Consideration should be given to your specific conditions in selecting the chemical to use. Cyanamid and Uramon have both given satisfactory weed control. Uramon has given outstanding control of soil-borne diseases (root knot, black root rot, and Granville wilt). This permits permanent plant bed sides at convenient locations where the soil type is suitable and there is a good supply of running water. Cyanamid does not control soil-borne diseases. Cyanamid should be used on the dark colored, low-lying soils of the Coastal plain because Uramon has not been too satisfactory on this type of soil. Cyanamid is also preferred on the clay soils of the Old Belt area where Uramon has

given some unsatisfactory results. Time is required to kill the weed seed and for the poisonous materials to be leached from the soil or changed to a harmless material. Therefore, the treatment should be applied at least 90 days before seeding.

Clean all weeds and trash from the area to be used for the bed. Prepare a fine, clod-free bed by breaking, discing, harrowing, and raking until smooth. Clods larger than a garden cherry will prevent weed seed inside from being killed.

Broadcast 1/4 pound of Uramon or Cyanamid per square yard of plant bed. This should be done immediately after preparing the bed and before the soil has had time to dry out.

Merchants Get Sane Advice

Told To Be On Lookout For Used Scales Now Being Sent Into State For Resale

RALEIGH.—C. D. Baucom, superintendent of the Weights and Measures division of the State Department of Agriculture, has warned North Carolina merchants to be on the alert in the purchase of used scales which are now being sent into this State for resale.

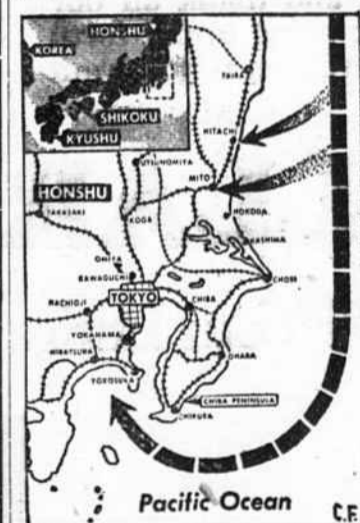
Within the past month, Baucom said, 260 of these scales have been tested and less than four per cent were found to be in "workable" condition. The scales not approved were condemned and will be held until they can be placed in good condition. In the event this is not possible, they may be destroyed.

Of the 260 scales examined, 150 were found in Goldsboro, 10 in Raleigh, and 100 in Charlotte. Baucom said his inspectors are now "on the trail" of others which have been shipped into this State in recent weeks.

Superintendent Baucom pointed to the need for additional scales in North Carolina, but pointed out that "we cannot accept scales which have been condemned elsewhere."

"Any person purchasing scales from anyone other than a legitimate scale dealer should make certain they are in good condition before payment is made," advised Baucom. He explained that the Scale Mechanic Act was set up to protect owners and users of scales against the practices of the unscrupulous, incompetent, and fraudulent "self-named" scale mechanics.

He said the law forbids the sale or moving of any condemned scale until it has been put in a satisfactory weighing condition.
