maw township grower, stated Monday that his plants already have six leaves and will be ready to set out before he gets his land ready if the rains do not hold off. C. C. Russ, also of Waccamaw, was equally optimistic about both his own plants and those of his neighbor growers.

With no further rains it will be a day or two longer before the majority of the tobacco growers can get into their fields for the purpose of plowing. Once all of the lands become dry enough it will be a race between the growth of the tobacco plants and getting the land ready to receive them.

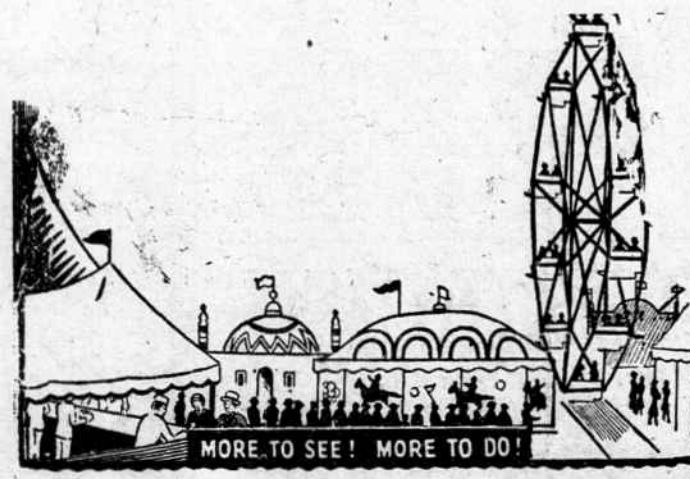
