John L. Stone, Shallotte township farmer, reported Monday that his Clinton oats are growing fine and are mighty pretty. He was very much pleased at the prospects. Just a couple of hours before Mr. Stone was seen Herbert Swain, of Southport made a similar report on his oats.

Both Mr. Stone and Mr. Swain were presented with three-bushel bags of the Clinton oats for planting early in February. County Agent J. E. Dodson was given another three bushels for his farm in Waccamaw township. All of the seed oats were donated through The State Port Pilot by M. B. Graham, Iowa farmer and dairyman.

Popcorn May Be New Crop

Winnabow Farmer Turning To His Crop After Being Rained Out Of Planting Usual Amount Of Small Grain

Fall and winter rains prevented Earl Earp, Winnabow farmer, from getting in more than 40 acres of grain. He planted 30 acres in wheat and 10 acres in oats.

Never having planted much tobacco, the acreage reduction in that crop does not bother him, but he still has to look around for crops to take the place of the 60 acres that he had planned to have in grain. Some of this will go in an increase of both peanuts and corn. Some, perhaps in potatoes, 5 acres in cotton and he plans to try out one new crop.

He stated Monday that he will plant three and a half acres in popcorn and see how that will do. Excellent markets for this crop are to be found in Georgia, Alabama and various other places.

So far as is known, this will be the first time in recent years that any Brunswick farmer has gone into popcorn growing as a staple farm crop. Many farmers plant a row or two of it for use at home, but there does not appear to have been any effort to make it a regular crop.

Pritchard And Wilkinson Lead State G. O. P. Ticket This Year

North Carolina Republicans Nominate Full Slate At Quadrennial Convention In Durham; Five Delegates Represent Columbus County At Meeting

North Carolina Republicans nominated George M. Pritchard of Asheville for Governor and John Wilkinson of Washington for United States Senator at their quadrennial convention in Durham Thursday.

Wilkinson, the keynote speaker at the G. O. P. county convention in Whiteville, will oppose either J. Melville Broughton or Senator William B. Umstead in the election this Fall.

Other State candidates nominated by Republicans were:

Kyle Hayes of Wilkesboro, lieutenant-governor; H. F. Seawell, Jr. of Carthage, attorney-general; James S. Dockery of Rutherfordton, Secretary of State

J. M. Van Noy of Charlotte, State Auditor; Watt H. Gregg of Boone, Commissioner of Agriculture; Buford T. Henderson of Winston-Salem, superintendent of Public Instruction; M. K. Harriel of Charlotte, commissioner of Labor; D. H. Clifton of Clinton, Insurance Commissioner; Ben L. Spence of Siler City, State Treasurer; and Robert H. McNeill of Statesville, Associate Justice of Supreme Court.

J. E. Broyhill of Lenoir was named National Committeeman in a four-ballot fight in which Hobart Morton of Albemarle was the principal opponent. He succeeds former Congressman Charles A. Jonas of Lincolnton.
