**Democrats and Republicans** (Continued from page one) was very close, with victory going to the present representative by a margin of 1152 votes to 1128.

Ward, Rabon and Williams scored a clear majority in their race for commissioner. Ward was high with 113; Rabon next with 102 and Williams third with 105.1. W. H. Brew had 893; J. W. Stanley 865; Dave Ross 532; W. A. Allen 368; Geddie Jones 264.

Voting was light for the Republicans. Closest race was between B. A. Russ, with 273 votes to 265 for Raleigh Babson in their race for Register of Deeds nomination. Kopp won over B. G. Simmons for nomination for Recorder by a vote of 331 to 207. Hewett had 392 votes to 144 for King in the race for House of Representatives nomination.

High man among the candidates for Republican commissioners was Evans with 431 votes, followed by Swain with 277 and Trott with 268. Reynolds had 139,

Maultsby 52, Klutz 33, Danford 111, Norris 200, and Smith 71.

In township contests J. E. Long are Republican nominees for justices of the peace for Shallotte township.

There will be no second primary race for any Brunswick county office.
