

**Use Worm Medicine With Care On Calf**

**FFA and 4-H Camps At White Lake Draw Members From All Over State**

**Columbus County Among Those Making Reservations; Varied Programs In Evidence For Both Groups**

Two of the most widely used camps in the farm circles of North Carolina are the Future Farmers of America and the 4-H clubs camps at White Lake near Elizabethtown in Bladen county.

The 4-H Clubs camp is owned by Bladen county and operated by R. B. Harper, agricultural agent and Mrs. Lillian Hester, Home Demonstration agent.

Club members from the following counties have already made reservations this season: Lenoir, Edgecombe, Jones, Hyde, Haywood, Halifax, Northampton, Gates and Hertford, Columbus, Carteret and Onslow, Cumberland, Bladen—a total of fourteen counties already represented. In addition the Johnston County Older Youth Club has made reservations for a week end stay.

The 4-H club reservation is from Monday to Saturday morning.

Illustrative of the delegations is that from Hyde county which brought thirty-eight boys and girls to the camp under the supervision of J. C. Woodward, agricultural teacher, and Mrs. Gilbert Tunnell, Home Demonstration Agent.

In addition to its two supervisors the Hyde County delegation has an instructor: 4-H Club records, L. R. Harrell, of Raleigh; Insects, J. T. Conner, Extension Entomologist; First Aid, Miss Bessie Gibbs; handicraft stenciling, Mrs. Gilbert Tunnell; woodcraft, J. C. Woodward; recreation, Mrs. Gwendolen Marshall; life guard, Curtis Blake.

The day starts with the flag raising and setting up exercises, followed by breakfast, study periods, instruction, competitive games, lunch, rest period, competitive games, supper, recreation, vesper program. Included in recreation, of course, are the water sports.

No 4-H club member is permitted to attend the camp unless work on the projects accepted by the member are fully up to date.

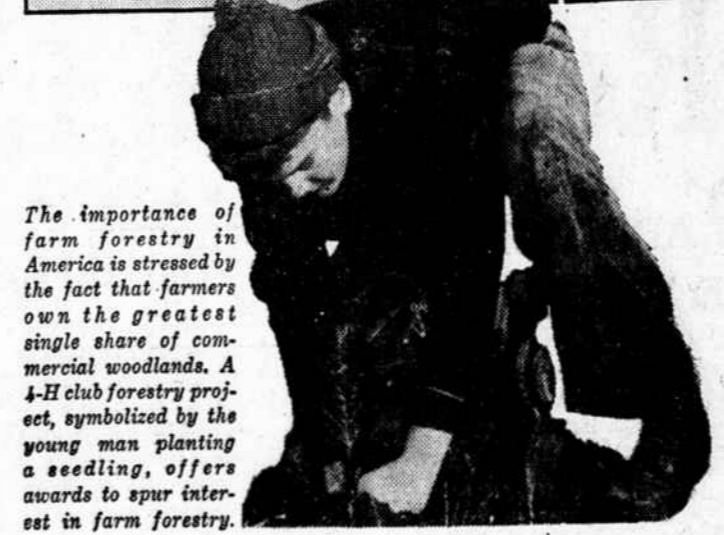
The delegations averaged sixteen to twenty members each so that for the week about 250 members were present and the guests brought the camp total attendance up to 310.

The importance of farm forestry in America is stressed by the fact that farmers own the greatest single share of commercial woodlands. A 4-H club forestry project, symbolized by the young man planting a seedling, offers awards to spur interest in farm forestry.

The stake of farm boys and girls in the woodlands of this state, and of America as a whole, is emphasized by new national and state awards for a 4-H club project in forestry, which include medals for state winners, and scholarships and trips for regional winners.

Four-H club members in this community, interested in forestry, are eligible to compete for these awards which include:

A gold medal for the state winner.

One of four regional \$200 cash scholarships.

One of four trips to the next 4-H club congress in Chicago.

The four areas in which regional awards are being made are the West, South, Central states and Northeast.

The sponsor for these awards is the American Forest Products Industries, a national association of lumber, pulp and paper, plywood and other forest industries.
