There is a 14th place, to be filled in by the registrar, that provides a personal description of the registrant—race, color of eyes and hair, approximate height and weight.

In many cases, the answers given on the registration card will provide the facts for draft deferment. Any registrant who is a husband, a father or a veteran with more than 90 days' service in World War II won't even be asked to fill out a classification questionnaire.

These questionnaires will start going out from local boards by September 7. Registrants have 10 days to fill them out and return them. Their answers are secret and will determine such deferments as those based on dependents, occupation or conscientious objection.
