

## BURNING PERMIT

Continued From Page One Columbus County.

shall be unlawful for any person, ignite any material in any of the areas of woodlands under the protection of the State Forest Service or within five hundred feet of any such protected area between the first day of February and the first day of June, inclusive or between the first day of October and the thirtieth day of November, inclusive, in any year, without first obtaining from the State Forester or one of his authorized agents a permit to set out fire or ignite any material in such above mentioned protected areas; no charge shall be made for the granting of said permits.

This section shall not apply to my fires started or caused to be started within five hundred feet of a dwelling house.

Any person, firm or corporation violating this Act shall be guilty of a misdeameanor, anl upon conviction shall be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisoned for a period of not more than 30 days.
