

Captain Price Laid To Rest

Burial Took Place In Southport Cemetery Wednesday Following Masonic Rites

With ceremonies by the Phylaxias, lodge A. F. and A. M., with which organization he had held membership for more than 25 years, the body of Captain Jesse D. Price, native of Southport and long-time resident of Wilmington, was buried here Wednesday in the Southport cemetery.

Captain Price, 82-years old, died at his home on Harbor Island Sunday of last week after several days illness. He was a life-long member of St. Philips Episcopal church at Southport.

Born in Southport and spending his early life here, Captain Price took to the sea at an early

age, following it for many years. He later became associated with the Tidewater Power company and spent a quarter of a century in the service of this organization.

The funeral services were conducted at the Andrews Mortuary in Wilmington, before the body was brought here and were conducted by the Rev. E. B. Fisher, pastor of Trinity Methodist church who was assisted by the Rev. R. L. Sturgis, rector of St. Andrews Episcopal church on Wrightsville Sound. The Rev. Mr. Fisher also presided over committal rites at the graveside.

Besides his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Hansley Price, and a daughter, Mrs. A. Eugene Townsend Sr., and Annie Louise Price, he is also survived by four grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Mrs. Annie Kay Vitou, of Southport and Mrs. Harry Hayden, Wilmington. Two grandchildren, Mrs. William (Eleanor) Everhart, of Ardmore, Pa., and Mrs. A. C.

CRAB FACTORY
The location is across from the beach on the land side of the waterway, some distance west of the ferry.

It is reported that in addition to paying a good price for crabs caught and delivered to the plant by parties engaged in crabbing, the plant will depend largely on the by-product of the shrimping industry.

A great deal of crabs are caught daily by shrimp boats. Heretofore they have been promptly thrown back into the ocean. If the crab factory provides a market for this by product, as it is said that it will do, all of the Holden Beach boats can continue unloading their catches of shrimp and fish at their houses near the ferry, then can go on and unload the crabs at the factory. The Southport shrimp boats

can unload their catches of shrimp, fish and crabs at their regular houses in Southport and trucks can pick up the crabs at this point and carry them on to the factory.

Radio owners can still listen-in, but instead of hearing the constant chatter they will find their instruments more or less silent except when messages are being sent or received.

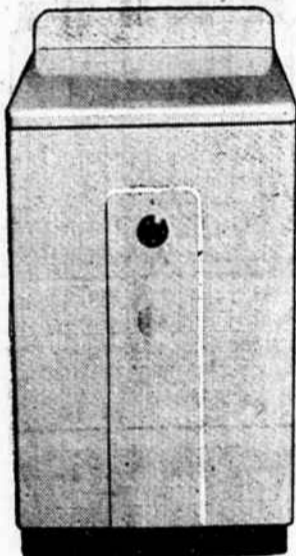
