## Mrs. Reil Hostess To Winnabow Club

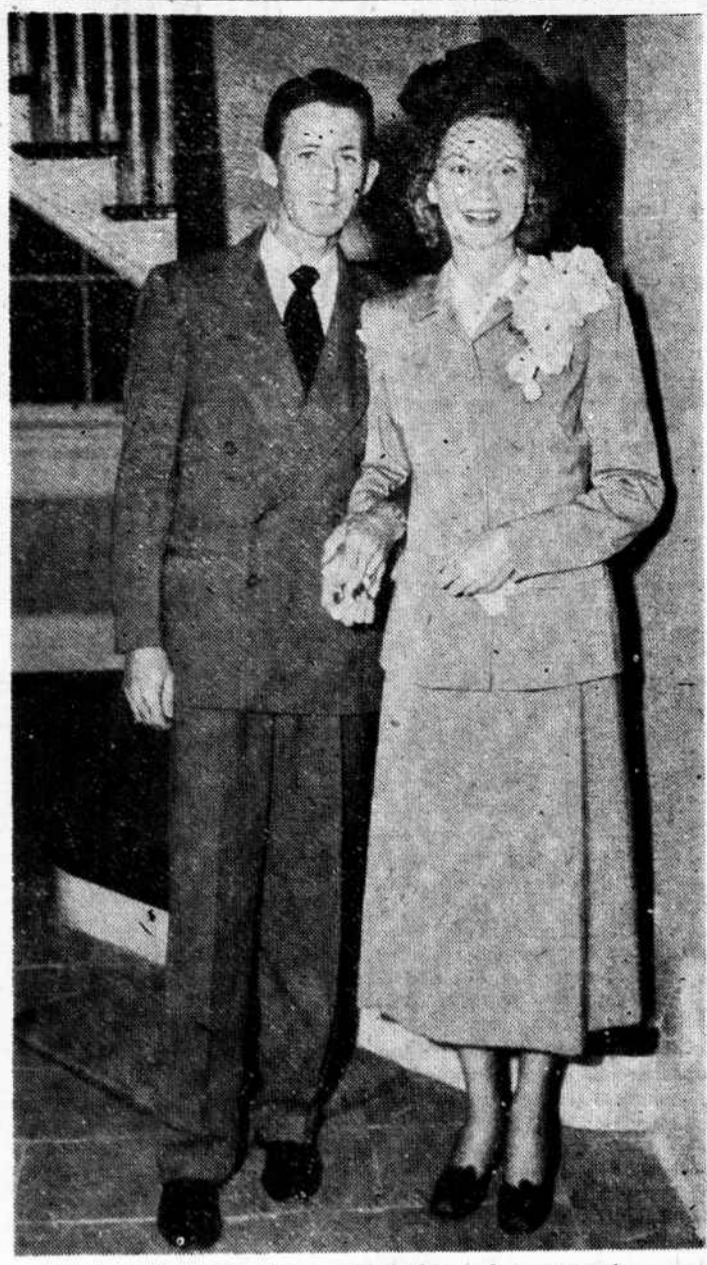
The Winnabow Home Demonstration Club met with Mrs. G. T. Reid on Thursday afternoon, January 20.
