## Crotalaria Is Improving Land

### Everett H. Sheppard Has Trouble Discing In Heavy Growth On Land Up River Road

On his already fine tomato plant land Everett H. Sheppard of Shiloh, N. J., planted crotalaria this year to keep out grass and weeds, as much as for soil improvement.

In all he planted about 20 acres in the crop and last week he began discing it down and found that he had a job on his hands. On the naturally rich soil the crotalaria had reached a height of five feet or more and it was thick to the point of being a jungle.

One passage of a heavy tractor-drawn disc made very little headway against the vegetation. It was found necessary to disc and double-disc. The machines headed up and down the fields and then crossways. The first passage of the machine bent the stalks down and stripped most of the limbs and leaves off. The cross-discing cut up the leaning stalks and left them lying on the ground. They will be buried under a little later, as it is now they are forming a thick carpet.

Mr. Sheppard says that the roots of the plants are a literal mass of nitrogen nodules. In addition to keeping out grass and weeds he believes that the crotalaria has greatly enriched the soil and made it just right for next spring's crop of tomatoes.

He begins cutting pulpwood and clearing 20 acres of new ground next week. This land will be

planted in watermelons next spring. The 20 acres he had in melons this year will be added to the acreage from which he produced several million tomato plants last spring. Year after next he will add 20 acres to his tomato plant growing acreage and he plans to keep on adding until he has more than 100 acres growing tomato plants each spring.
