A new attraction will be the parade of township queens before the day-time audience at noon. All of the finalists will be reviewed on stage shortly after the end of the parade in which they will participate.

Cecilia Horne, now Mrs. Luther Meares, is the reigning queen.

A band concert under the direction of Bob Hodges and miscellaneous entertainment will precede the dinner hour.

The Girls of the Golden West, Cullen Johnson's one-man show, amateur contests, and many other contests will furnish the entertainment during the afternoon.

Following the supper hour, queen candidates will parade in bathing suits as they are judged for the honors and prizes which go to the winner. The beauty contest is slated to begin at 8 p. m. and end at 8:45 with the crowning of the 1949 queen.

Awarding of \$600 in prizes will take place at 9 p. m.

After these crowd-drawing attractions will come the dances. Those who prefer to waltz will assemble in the north wing of the warehouse for the music of Nick Pinos and his musicians of Wilmington, while square dancers will go to the south wing of the warehouse where the Girls of the Golden West will play.

### Clemson, State Both Air-Minded

**Agricultural And Technical Schools Of Two Carolinas Meet In Traditional Battle In Raleigh Saturday Night**

RALEIGH, N. C. Sept. 26—Two air-minded football teams, Clemson's Tigers and North Carolina State's Wolfpack, will match aerial attacks Saturday night at 8 p. m. in Riddick Stadium when the two traditional Southern Conference foes square off for their annual battle.

Pitching Ray Matthews, Clemson's tailback par-excellence and State's trio of tossers, Ed Mooney, Bill Thompson and Ogden Smith, will likely stage one of the biggest displays of aerial fireworks seen in the conference this season.

Coach Beattie Feathers, of the Wolfpack makes no bones about his plans for relying on his passers. "Sure we'll throw often and I expect Clemson will do the same," the Wolfpack coach says.

The scrap between State and Clemson follows this year the general trend of all contests between the two schools. Despite a 17-7 edge for Clemson in the long rivalry, few contests have every been won by lopsided margins.

In 1946, for example, it took a 95-yard touchdown run by All-Southern Tailback Howard Turner to decide the battle in favor of State by 14-7, last year it

**Widely Known Southern Football Official And A Cousin Of Local Man Passes At Fayetteville; Had Visited Here**

H. Wiley Sholar, widely known Southern football referee and cousin of R. L. Sholar of Whiteville, died on Friday night in Fayetteville. His passing came as a surprise to friends and relatives, though he had been in failing health for the past year.

Sholar was formerly in business in Greensboro but, for the past eight years, had owned a lumber business in Lenoir, N. C.

He was born in Sumter, S. C. and attended Presbyterian College at Clinton, S. C.

As a referee he officiated in some of the nation's major college gridiron contests. Besides taking part in calling regular season games in 18 states during the past 25 years, he also refereed in several of the major post-season bowl games. Among these were the Rose, Sugar, Tangerine, Tobacco, and Shrine Bowls.

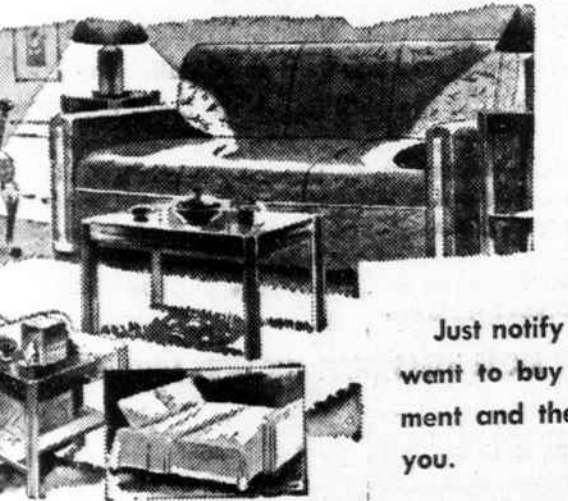
