Pecan Sales Hit High Figure For First Week Here

22,000 Pounds Of Nuts Are Marketed During Initial or contact me at 310 East Days Of 1949 Season On Whiteville Market

Prices on the Whiteville Pecan Market soared to new highs during the first week of operations as buyers reported a market of 'good quality and weight", according to Dave S. Neilson, executive secretary of the Whiteville Merchants Association.

Since the opening of the local market last Tuesday over 22,000 pounds of pecans have been sold with an average of \$17.00 per hundred. All types of nuts are bringing almost double last year's prices and growers' seem to be well pleased with the return.

Miller Brothers, F. C. X. Store 4.331.674.13 and Oscar High, leading buyers on the local market, have reported strong sales and good quality. 2.085,461.65 Local growers were urged by buyers to bring their pecans, in for sale now while the high 2,580,187.17 prices prevail., It is not known at this time whether the high prices will, continue, throughout the season or decline, as was the 376,195.62 case last season. In a move to continue the high 45,586-9 prices for local growers, buvers were urging shoppers for the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons to purchase North Cafelina grown pecans.
